



## What in the World? Career Fair Program

The What in the World? Career Fair program (WITW) is designed to introduce 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade students to science, technology, engineering, arts and math (STEAM) careers and motivate them to study & stay in school. It takes place in local elementary schools where local employers talk to small groups of students for 15 minutes.

Presenters explain how they use science and/or technology in their everyday work life. The students enjoy learning about different STEAM careers by seeing equipment or a tool that you bring (i.e. blueprints, stethoscope, or example on a laptop etc.). Conducting an engaging activity with the students always goes over well. After 15 minutes the students rotate to another presenter. The entire program lasts 90 minutes. The program is very informal and can be extremely rewarding.

For close to twenty years, WITW has helped students understand the importance of math and science classes. By speaking with presenters like you, they have learned about a world of opportunities open to them.

During the 2014–2015 school year, the North Museum provided programs to more than 4,500 students in 40 local schools. This would not be possible without the assistance of volunteers from local businesses like yours.
