Safety & Display Representative

- Living organisms, including plants
- Soil, sand, rock, etc.
- Taxidermy/ Preserved specimens or human/animal parts or body fluid
- Human or animal food
- Plant materials (living, dead, or preserved) raw or unprocessed
- Glass objects unless deemed by the Display and Safety Committee to be an integral and necessary
- All chemicals including; water, dry ice, drugs/medications, test strips/chemicals, etc.
- All hazardous devices such as weapons, ammunition, type 3 & 4 lasers, syringes, needles, etc.
- Flames or highly flammable materials
- Batteries with open-top cells
- Awards, medals, business cards, flags, logos, CDs, DVDs, brochures, booklets, endorsements, etc.
- Visual presentations depicting vertebrate animals in surgery, dissections, necropsies, lab procedures, etc.
- Finalist identification like – name, postal addresses, e-mail addresses, telephone, etc.
- Active Internet or e-mail connections as part of displaying or operating the project
- Prior years' written material or visual depictions on the vertical display board
- Any apparatus deemed unsafe by the Display and Safety Committee
- Any apparatus with unshielded belts, pulleys, chains, or moving parts with tension or pinch
- Any apparatus producing temperatures that will cause physical burns if not adequately insulated

- Photographs/visual images of other persons (not contestant) must have permission in writing from the photographed student and parent in not over 18 years old.
